Success Story of the Month

Waynesburg Elementary School in Waynesburg, Kentucky put in the work and is now seeing RESULTS! EES has been implementing its Framing Your Success program this school year to help Waynesburg teachers better understand common core standards and focus on a higher-level of questioning. Through the leadership provided by Principal Mark Upchurch and Mrs. Missy Robbins, the Academic Program Consultant, teachers were given the support and tools necessary to make EES' Continuous Improvement Cycle model meet their needs.

"We are very excited with our improvements across the board," said Missy Robbins.

These improvements include:

- Kindergarten had 93.2% of students scoring at a level 3 or 4 in reading on PAS A (up from 57.2%)
- 1st Grade had 82.2% of students scoring at a level 3 or 4 in reading on PAS A (up from 20%)
- Math showed increases at all levels.

Congrats to the whole team of teachers, administrators, and students for their hard work!
