Wayne County Masters the Mastery Matrix

On Friday April 27th, approximately 40 staff gathered in the Wayne County Ceredo-Kenova Elementary School gymnasium for an afternoon of training on Depth of Knowledge. Deidre Farley, the school principal, is a dynamic instructional leader who enthusiastically prepared her staff for the afternoon session. The school houses close to 600 students grades K-5 and faces the same challenges all schools face across the nation: how to best prepare students for the 21st Century in this rapidly changing world.

The staff worked in small teams developing a Mastery Matrix using the DOK chart as a guide. The Mastery Matrix is an effective tool developed by Edwards Educational Services which provides teachers with an instructional framework. The framework assists teachers in lesson design. It also prompts the educator to consider the cognitive complexity of the task or learning objective, determine how the objective is aligned with the standards, and what the purpose of the lesson is. By incorporating increasingly complex critical thinking and independent learning strategies, teachers are creating a learning environment that promotes and engenders mastery.

The staff all completed a Mastery Matrix that ranged from an Ocean Unit for second grade to the Civil War. Teachers collaborated on DOK levels that would reflect high student engagement and require analysis. The day went quickly and each team submitted a finished product to the principal. Ms. Farley will meet with the respective teams at a later date to review the Matrixes. Great work, Ceredo-Kenova Elementary!
