Over 40 administrators, aspiring administrators, and superintendents gathered at the Stonewall Resort in Roanoke, West Virginia on June 18th -20th for an Institute that served as a culmination of training for cohort participants. Raleigh County, McDowell County and Fayette County were all represented, as well as a team from Wirt County led by their superintendent, Dr. MaryJane Pope Albin.

Dr. Steve Edwards, president and CEO of Edwards Educational Services, and Dr. Anthony Annunziato, Project Director launched the Institute by addressing salient topics such as Visionary Leadership and Leading for Change: Strategic Planning. Cohort members and participants engaged in high level conversations about the challenges
